1	PROCEEDINGS
2	MS. SINGER: The first order of
3	business is the roll call.
4	MS. LYRAS: Cecile Singer?
5	MS. SINGER: Here.
6	MS. LYRAS: Peter Kischak?
7	MR. KISCHAK: Here.
8	MS. LYRAS: And Melissa
9	Nacerino is excused.
10	We have a quorum.
11	MS. SINGER: The minutes of the
12	December 8th meeting are included in
13	the packet. If you will just review
14	it.
15	Are there any additions or
16	corrections? May I have a motion to
17	accept the minutes?
18	MR. KISCHAK: I make a motion.
19	MS. SINGER: And I second it.
20	MR. DANIELE: There should be a
21	power point entitled Yonkers Economic
22	Development Corporation. I'm going
23	to ask you to turn to page 1.
24	Again the audit fieldwork is
25	complete. Our scope of the fieldwork

1	PROCEEDINGS
2	is the same that we described back in
3	December January in our planning
4	communication.
5	The financial statements have
6	been drafted and reviewed by
7	management and reviewed by our
8	quality control team.
9	Again we anticipate an
10	unmodified opinion. Again, which is
11	a clean opinion.
12	We do have some open items, one
13	legal confirmation and one party
14	questionnaire that Mary is following
15	up and hopefully we'll get that by
16	the end of this week.
17	MS. SINGER: Say that again.
18	The open items are?
19	MR. DANIELE: There's one legal
20	confirmation. I believe that's Greg
21	Young and one related party
22	questionnaire. I believe that's the
23	Mayor.
24	Again, there is some public
25	authority documents that we will get

2	once this meeting is complete and
3	there are some forms that are signed
4	off on. We do have the draft. We
5	are just waiting for the final
6	approval and the completed documents.
7	Again, we have the independent
8	auditors report as I mentioned.
9	We've issued an unmodified opinion
10	and again, as far as internal control
11	there was nothing no material
12	weaknesses but we'll talk about that
13	in a minute.
14	If you turn to page we'll
15	start on page 3. This is a statement
16	of activities and revenues and
17	expenses that occurred during the
18	year as compared to 2016.
19	As you can see there are some
20	agency fees, some mortgage recording
21	tax exemption fees that amount to
22	\$15,000 this year as compared to
23	2,500 in the prior year and then some
24	miscellaneous revenue.
25	There are also some expenses

2	which were pretty much in line.
3	There were some miscellaneous
4	expenses that are kind of small and
5	we kind of grouped together, but as
6	you can see the income minus the
7	expenses result in about a \$34,000
8	loss for the year.
9	There were some non-operating
10	revenues and expenses, interest
11	income from the Larkin Garage.
12	Pretty consistent. Those are four
13	quarters comparable to 2016. There's
14	some interest expense again relating
15	to the Larkin Garage and the
16	Warburton Wells Project.
17	Those non-operating revenues
18	net amount to \$76,000. So, the
19	agency or the corporation had
20	earnings of about \$41,000 in 2017,
21	compared to about 230,000 in the
22	prior year.
23	Just in the prior year you
24	could see the other income line.
25	There was some forgiveness of a

2	ground lease in the prior year that
3	triggered the increase in income and
4	that was a one time thing. That
5	didn't occur in 2017.
6	All in all the corporation was
7	able to add \$41,000 to its net
8	position. We started the year at
9	\$11.29 million and end the year at
10	\$11.33 million.
11	If you turn back to page 2, all
12	that money is unrestricted, the \$11.3
13	million.
14	You do have assets of \$13.7
15	million. Mostly in the form of that
16	note receivable for the project. We
17	do have some liability. The big one
18	there is a note payable that you
19	acquired from Sterling Bank relating
20	to that project, and as Pat has
21	pointed out to me this new market tax
22	structure actually ends December of
23	'18 right where
24	MR. SERENSON: December of '18
25	for Warburton Wells and August of '18

2	for the Larkin Garage.
3	MR. DANIELE: At that point
4	there's no receivables forgiven.
5	MR. SERENSON: That's a Sean
6	thing, but some of the stuff is going
7	to go away, and Mary has already
8	started discussions with Sean to make
9	sure we know what's going to happen
10	before you want to know what's
11	going in happening going in, not
12	going out.
13	MR. DANIELE: A piece of this
14	will effect in December of '18 and
15	then go in to '19.
16	MR. SERENSON: '19 should be
17	clear of all the new market tax
18	credits.
19	MR. DANIELE: Okay. Again page
20	4, 5, 6 and 7 just like the IDA, it
21	just describes the responsibilities.
22	Again, there were no changes in
23	the significant accounting policies.
24	Certain estimates are made. We
25	looked at those Those disclosures

2	are reasonable. No difficulties in
3	performing the audit or with
4	management.
5	There were no uncorrected
6	misstatements meaning if there was an
7	entry that we found or proposed, it
8	was recorded by management.
9	No disagreements with
10	management with respect to YEDC.
11	After page 8 again the
12	Communication of Internal Control
13	Matters. Again, I'm happy to report
14	no material weaknesses or significant
15	deficiencies. Actually we had no
16	findings relating to the YEDC.
17	And again, at the conclusion of
18	the audit which we expect to happen
19	once we get these related party and
20	legal confirmations, we'll request a
21	representation letter that just lays
22	our what you've given us, what our
23	responsibilities our and everything
24	we found to be in order. That will

2	be signed hopefully the end of this
3	week or the following week and that's
4	really it.
5	Again, there is some I know
6	you went through the MD&A and had
7	some questions which we will address
8	after this meeting to expand on your
9	questions.
10	MS. SINGER: Right. So,
11	yesterday when I looked at this there
12	was some questions about notes that
13	what we needed to do and that audit
14	now and we'll have it and we'll do a
15	copy we will send it to you. It's
16	just when we hear the aggregate
17	amounts of this we give the largest
18	piece but not anything of the smaller
19	areas. We leave open something so we
20	should know what other things that
21	are being disbursed in order to when
22	we come here.
23	MR. KISCHAK: Okay.
24	MS. SINGER: Do you have any
25	questions?

4	MS. SINGER: So, if there are
5	no further questions, now I have a

19	we hope that you will nurture
20	MR. SERENSON: I thank the
21	board and everybody here for making
22	this a good, easy job, interesting
23	and challenging at times, but it was
24	good. I thank you.
25	MS. LYRAS: We thank you, Pat.

21	a job and Jamie, excellent.
22	We thank you and then we'll
23	receive the notes from the addendum.
