And with the cooperation of our auditors and our outside employee, who they said is available even at 10 o'clock at night, we have been able to have an exemplary process.

In an audit process, what was very interesting is that we have notes. And the notes are because of the complexity of a lot of our transactions. We were very concerned about a particular note because it kept saying, "Leverage, leverage, leverage." And so we've learned from the financial crisis that it's not good to have a note with five different leverages in it. So, we went through it and we were able to produce something that I think gives a much better picture. And so, the objective is always transparency. And so, when you

7 Proceedings 1 2 submit something, there are people who believe you 3 should have no notes at all. But with our transactions it really makes a very big difference. 4 And in the way we were able to rewrite this several 5 6 times, even I got to have one crack at it, which 7 wasn't the one that was finally accepted. But really, so, it's important because of the work that 8 9 we do that anybody who picks it up will be able to understand what we are doing. 10 11 So, I would ask the Audit Committee 12 recommend the approval of the Audit as submitted. 13 May I have a motion? rather complex. To boil it down, as an involved party, the EDC received certain money and it loaned it out which creates a New Market Tax Credit

Program by official funds for the construction of that project. As a party to it, at this point, there are debt payments that are supposed to be made between parties that come to the Yonkers

Economic Development Corporation out of cash flow with the Yonkers Community Development Agency, an involved party. Again, subject to cash flow.

At this point, sale proceeds from the H & I parcel are going to be utilized by the IDA to purchase the existing note which EDC is involved with, originally 2.6 million. There's 2.5 million left. The IDA will purchase that note, agree to forebear the payments of debt service during the New Market Tax Credit Compliance Period. That Compliance Period is a seven year period under Federal -- under Internal Revenue Code, expires in 2018. As I said at the start, EDC is an involved party in this transaction so this resolution would authorize amendments to some of the documents to reflect this change that involves the note and forbearance.

MS. GERRY: So, I will add, as I did at

Proceedings

the IDA Meeting, that this is kind of a corollary of what the IDA Board heard this morning with regard to the closing on the H & I property. There was a thought, as we always try to do with all of our transactions, to take the good revenues that came from the H & I sale and apply them to something that was becoming a complicated transaction that we needed a solution for. So, there were all kinds of obligations, CDA related, YEDC, IDA and city subsidies on this Larkin Garage Project, which also triggered not only to the complexity of the New Market Tax Credit but also because the County of Westchester had promised but never delivered a 2.5 million dollar capital infusion into the Larkin Garage Project.

So, the Larkin Garage Project was one of those extraordinarily complex deals which both the city and the CDA managed the debt and subsidized.

So, by taking the money from the H & I sale and taking those revenues and buying out the debt, having the IDA buy out the debt, and the YEDC forebear, we're actually lightening the financial load of the CDA which is effectively managing all the burdens of the Larkin Garage debt. So, between the long-winded

stories of David and I, this is the corollary of what the IDA Board heard earlier this morning and it's just our effort to kind of pay forward, as we said, taking the proceeds of a good deal to simplifying, you know, one of our more complex financial arrangements that the Mayor inherited as did this board.

MAYOR SPANO: Basically, you're taking the money from here and paying off a debt of the Larkin Garage. That's what's it does.

MS. SINGER: But there were so many sub-transactions to do with it. It's the eligibility for benefits that really -- so, the trick of it is the eligibility for benefits. And then, what you had to go through to become eligible for the benefit. So, there was so many sub-agreements, you know --

MAYOR SPANO: Larkin Garage is very complicated. They need to simplify the Larkin Garage.

MS. SINGER: Are there any questions? MAYOR SPANO: Thank you for your hard work on that.

MS. SINGER: If there are, we'll give you
