1	Since the corporation has not met since June
2	2014 we have financials from May to September. YEDC
3	received agency fees from Leake and Watts in June for
4	\$211,000. There hasn't been any spending within the YEDC
5	for the staff and monthly bills to the accountant. We
6	have legal fees, as well.
7	YEDC at the end of September had \$374,000 on
8	hand. We also have Our accountant Pat Serenson for any
9	questions.
10	MS. SINGER: Are there any questions?
11	MR. KISCHAK: I have none.
12	MAYOR SPANO: Make a motion.
13	MR. KISCHAK: Second.
14	MS. SINGER: All in favor?
15	(Chorus of Ayes)
16	MS. SINGER: Now, the YEDC budget 2015 and
17	three year budget. You have before you also the 2014
18	budget. So are there any benefits, do you want to
19	explain?
20	MS. MEHRA: Sure, the benefits went down from
21	2014 to 2015 due to Obamacare, so the monthly expenses
22	were lowered from 2014. That's why we are projecting for
23	2015, \$15,000.
24	MS. SINGER: And auditing and accounting fees
25	are projections, and legal, small differentials.

1	Marketing, there are some increases. Deepika, do you
2	want to talk to that?
3	MS. MEHRA: We are just estimating any
4	marketing initiatives that we may take over in 2015.
5	That's where we have projected just a little increase in
6	2015 as opposed to 2014.
7	MS. SINGER: And in the economic development
8	initiatives I assume these are also projections?
9	MS. MEHRA: Yes.
10	MS. SINGER: And interest expense, that comes
11	from the Larkin garage arrangement that we have and the
12	promissory note. Do you want to explain that, Deepika?
13	MS. MEHRA: Mr. Serenson will explain.
14	MR. SERENSON: The deal was when the project
15	went through we would collect rents, we would pay Hudson
16	Valley on the \$2,629,000 loan, plus CD on the \$300,000.00
17	loan they have with Hudson Valley as a back-up. Anything
18	remaining after that would go to the Ground lease.
19	Whatever income came in there would be an outflow which
20	would be income.
21	MAYOR SPANO: What was the \$2 million loan?
22	MR. SERENSEN: We were short, the County
23	didn't come up with all their funds and we had to borrow
24	\$2.6 million from Hudson Valley to complete the project.
25	MAYOR SPANO: Didn't the city bond \$2 million?

1	MR. SERENSON: The loan we took from the bank
2	there is no principle payment until 2018 which is when
3	the federal tax credit comes due.
4	There is no bond there. We actually borrowed
5	the money from Hudson Valley.
6	MAYOR SPANO: Right, we have a revenue
7	anticipation note on \$2 million, then we bonded \$2
8	million, so I am lost.
9	MR. SERENSON: The total piece to the city was
10	I believe, 10 million. CDA put some money, the County
11	was supposed to put some money in, they didn't.
12	MAYOR SPANO: Okay. We'll look into it.
13	MR. KISCHAK: Mr. Mayor, do you want to table
14	this?
15	MAYOR SPANO: Can we table this?
16	MS. SINGER: Yes. We want to table the budget
17	and we'll have to do it at a later date when we can
18	answer the question.
19	MS. MEHRA: Sure. It has to be posted by
20	November 1st, the budget, that's the only thing.
21	MR. YOUNG: You can post a tentative budget.
22	MS. SINGER: If we have to have it by November
23	1st I would say that rather than doing that we can even
24	do it if we can answer the question we can even do YEDC
25	business by telephone?

1 MR. YOUNG: Right.

MS. SINGER: It's not like IDA. So we'll have

a telephone conference and do it so that will be the best

way to handle it.

MR. KISCHAK: That's legal, Mr. Young?

MR. YOUNG: Yes.

MS. SINGER: While we are here I think it's important for us to go over, as you can see things come up projected, what we have projected for YEDC projects just like we went over the IDA projects. I'd ask about what we project.

MS. MEHRA: Sure. YEDC it's hard to tell which projects will come to close but right now we have two in the pipeline, Teutonia coming to YEDC by the first quarter of 2015 for bonds. And we have Ferncliff, we'll have a resolution today coming to YEDC for bonds on \$27 million that will give us at least \$278,000 in our agency fees.

DEPUTY MAYOR GERRY: I have a question. We were asked a week or so ago because the timing of Tuetonia to allow the bond that we had held to go back into the allocation pool so somebody else could use the bond allocation but they are going to close first quarter of 2015. Are we comfortable we have the flexibility to go back and take a new allocation out in 2015?

1 MR. YOUNG: It doesn't matter, you have to go 2 back in and request, or request a new amount you want to allocate to the new project. 3 MR. ROTHMAN: The bonding cap allocation, the 4 5 request was we want to keep it or put it back into the pool wasn't sufficient to begin with on the total amount 6 7 of bonds being sold, so either way we are going to have 8 to go back in 2015 to get the allocation. So, yes, we 9 are comfortable. DEPUTY MAYOR GERRY: They want to close in the 10 11 first quarter. We have to jump right in in the first 12 quarter? 13 MR. YOUNG: And request again, yes. MS. SINGER: Any further questions? 14 MS. MEHRA: We have the resolution for 15 16 consideration on Ferncliff. The budget we'll table for We'll do the resolution for Ferncliff. 17 now. 18 MS. SINGER: Okay. 19 MR. MALGIERI: Patrick Malgieri, partner, Harris Beach. Good morning. As was indicated today 20 21 before you is the official intent resolution, the initial resolution for Ferncliff Manor. Just brief background, 22 23 this is being induced by the initial resolution in December of 2013. The IDA induced the project as a 24

straight lease transaction but this project is being

25

undertaken by a not-for-profit entity, therefore, since 2008 IDAs have not been legally empowered, as you know, to induce a not-for profit facility, the so called facility bonds. YEDC didn't induce in December 2013 but the company that identified it was a for profit. Ferncliff, again, this project is being undertaken by a not-for-profit.

Quick background on the project itself, it's a residential facility for several children with the most severe autistic spectrum disorder. It's a two story school building, approximately 30,000 square feet, 11 six person homes in a renovated manor house, approximately 4,000 square feet for administrative space, furniture, fixtures and equipment and 72 students, 66 in residential capacity and six on a daytime capacity. Current total project cost estimate is \$23.4 million. According to the application we have no reason to believe that any of those numbers have necessarily changed. That includes \$23 million for new construction, 4,000 for FF&E.

Official intent resolution is up to \$27 million. That's to allow the project as they get closer and closer to the point of actual financing and issuance of a final bond resolution. In the event those numbers move it won't require us to come back and do another inducement resolution. Issue of the bonds will be

subject to the agreement on terms and conditions of the 1 2 bond documents as approved by the YEDC's counsel and by bond counsel. 3 4 Also, subject to approval by the Mayor holding 5 a public hearing pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code. Just one last point, I know that in 6 7 connection with the issuance of the approval for Leake 8 and Watts there were a number of questions regarding 9 YEDC's relationship both to the IDA and the City. As you may recall, our firm issued an opinion. We are 10 addressing those points. None of that research is 11 changed, none of those legal conclusions have changed. 12 YEDC bonds do not require IDA approval, they are not 13 14 bonds of the IDA nor are they bonds of the city or a department of the city, and all the bond documents 15 16 appropriately note that. Any questions? MS. SINGER: I think for the record just state 17 18 how long Ferncliff has been in Yonkers. Do you know? 19 MR. MALGIERI: I don't know, Mayor, I believe back in 1971. They were founded in 1931, so about 80 20 21 years. 22 MS. SINGER: Seventy-nine years. It has served 23 a very important population that is underserved. MR. MALGIERI: And that was indicated, this 24

will be anticipated now to be in the first quarter of
